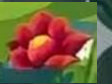
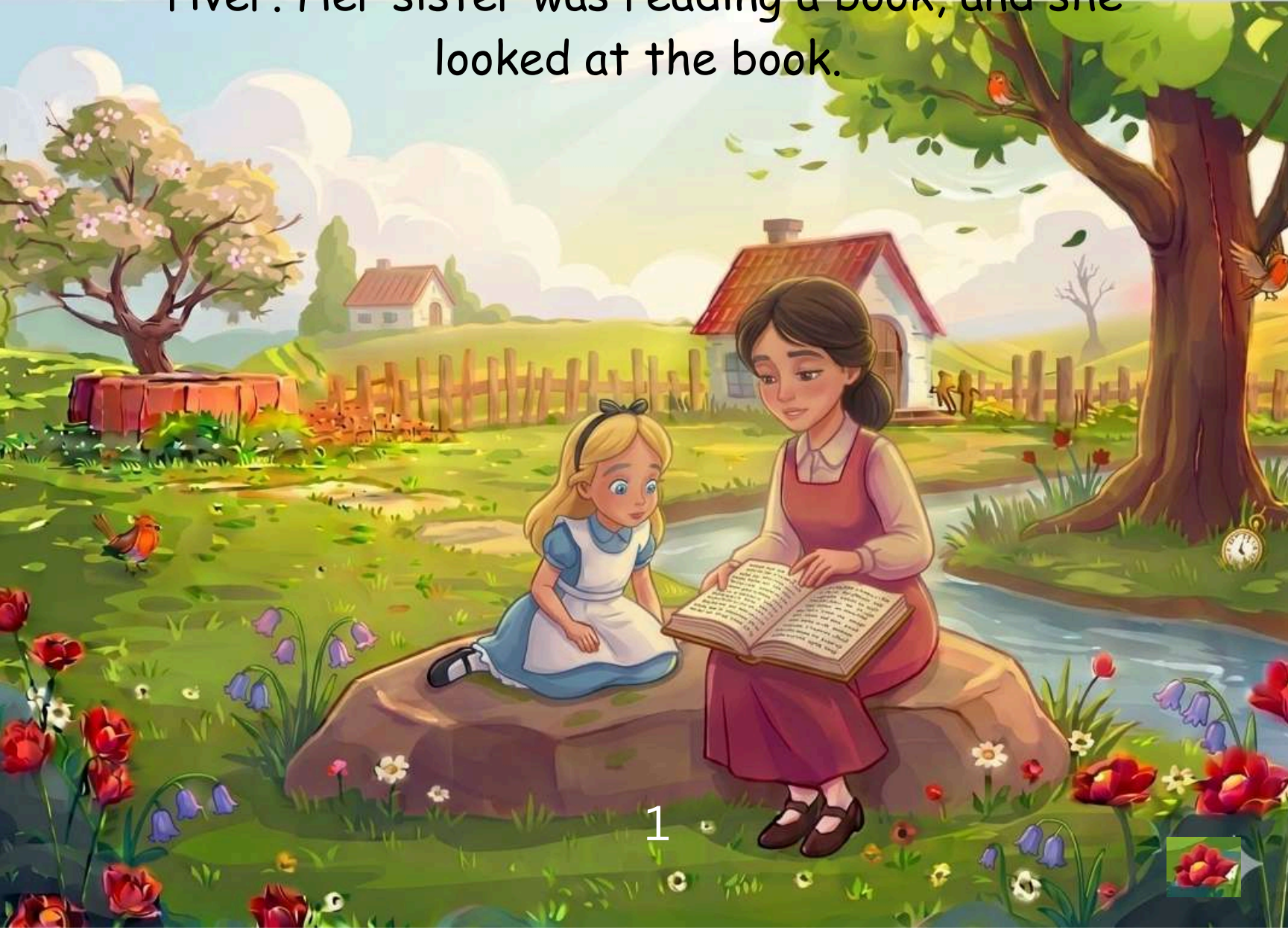

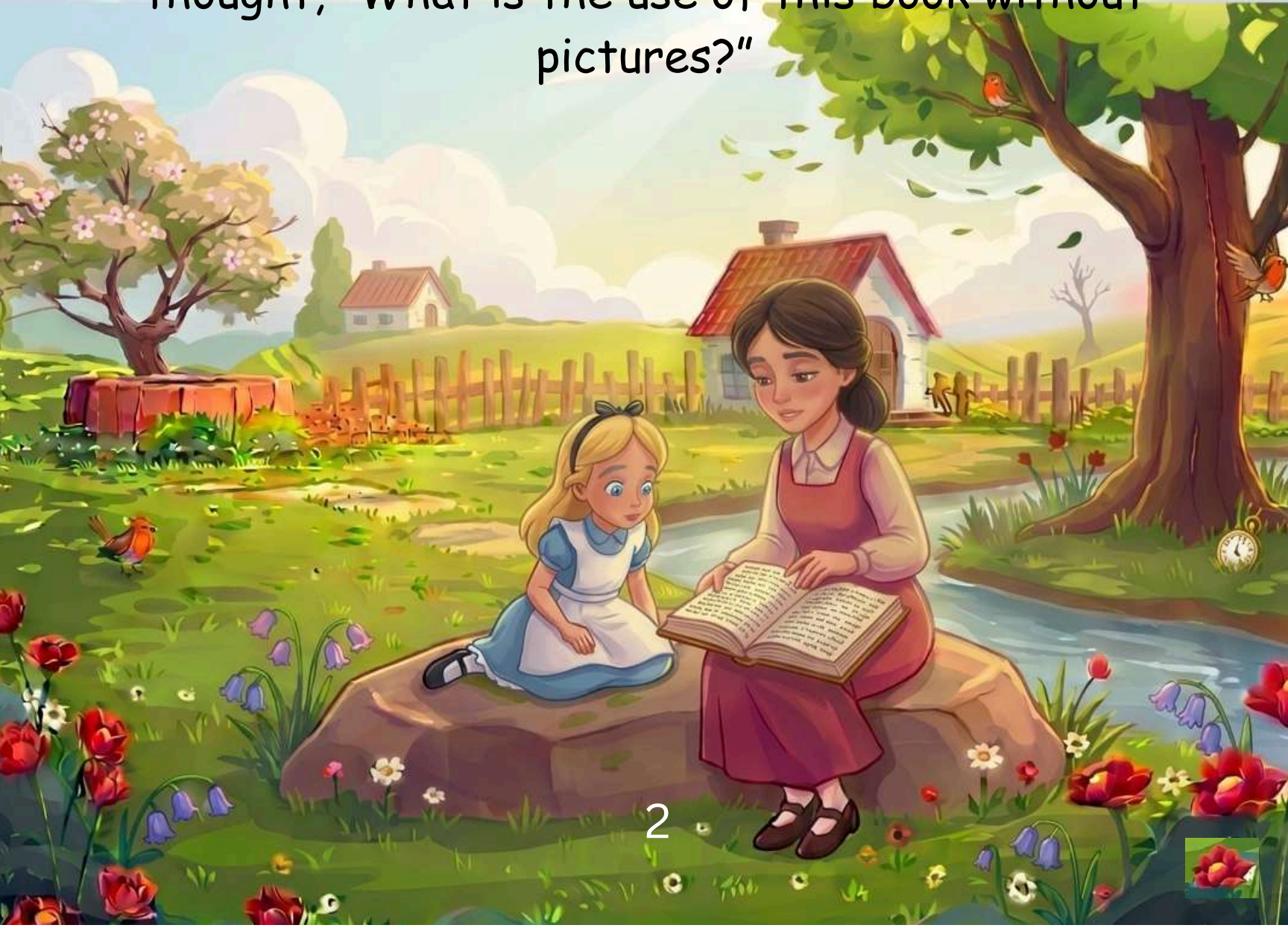

There were no pictures in the book. Alice thought, "What is the use of this book without pictures?"

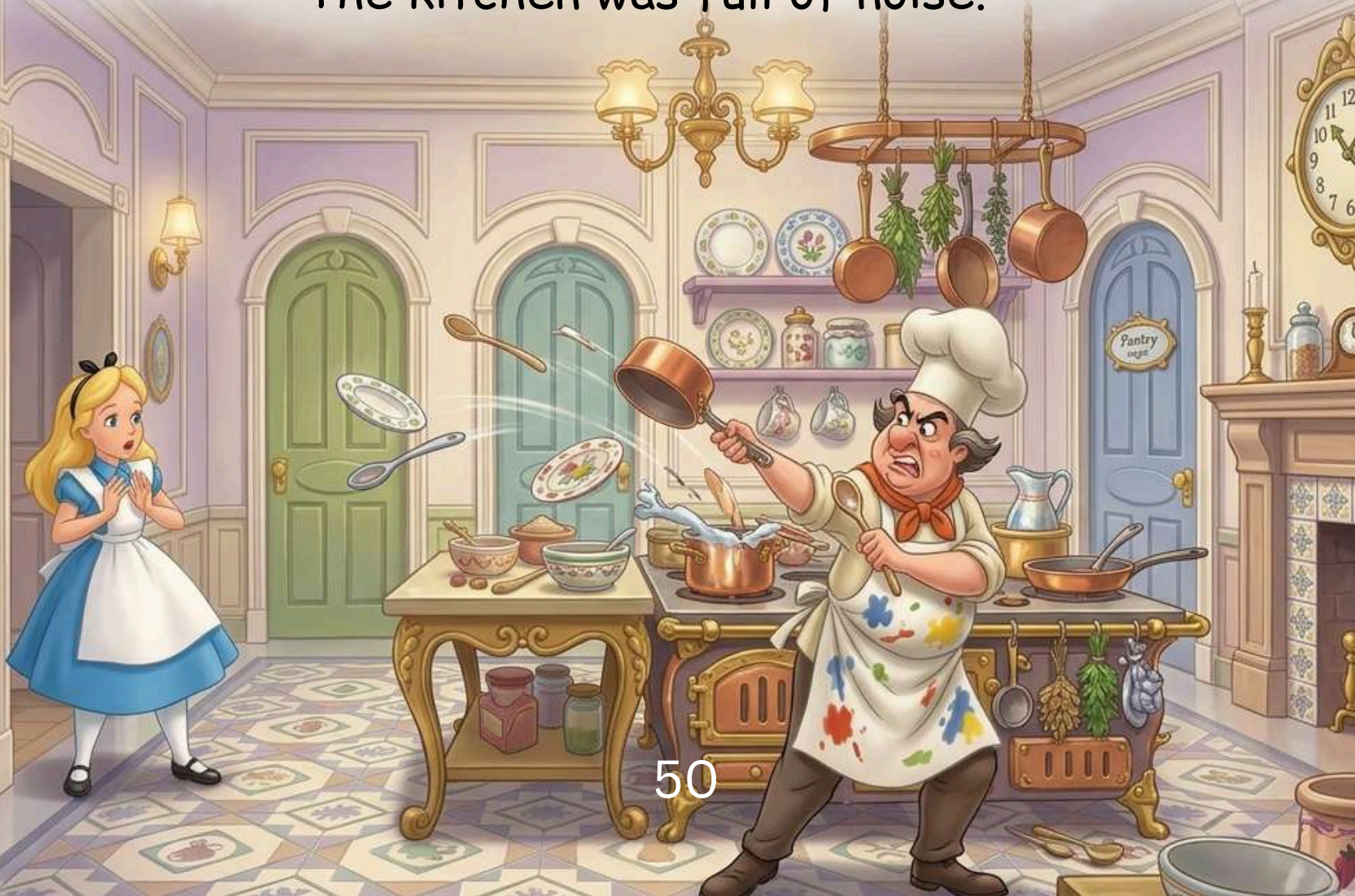


She was feeling bored and thought that something wonderful would happen soon.
