# Preface

Language is constantly evolving, shaped by cultural shifts, digital communications and everyday interactions. Slangs in particular, serve as an important reflection of societal trends, identity and creative expression. This slang dictionary has been compiled to serve a comprehensive source for understanding of modern and contemporary informal expressions. For younger readers, it provides clear explanations of slang terms commonly encountered in peer communication, fostering greater confidence and social connection. Moreover, for non-native speakers and language learners, the dictionary functions as a practical reference tool, supporting their efforts to understand and engage with contemporary informal discourse. By addressing the linguistic needs of

## Awks (adj.)

/awks / • (aks)

Short form of “awkward,” used to describe uncomfortable or embarrassing situations.

A phrase used when someone evokes deep emotions.

Slang derived from “bourgeois,” used to describe someone or something that is fancy, high-class, or pretentious—often in a flashy or showy way.

A slang term used to describe someone or something that is outdated, trying too hard to be trendy, or no longer considered cool—typically in a millennial way.
